Members of INET represent many disciplines: education, psychology, sociology, anthropology, and related social sciences. Every other year, members of INET convene at the start of the annual meeting of the American Educational Research Association (AERA) to report their work on family and community involvement, share ideas, identify next steps, and renew friendships.

The **20**th International Roundtable on School, Family, and Community Partnerships will be held Friday, April **17**, **2020** in San Francisco (at an AERA location to be announced). - Role of technology in improving communications from school-to-home and home-to-school
- Students' voices and roles in partnership programs
- Preparing future teachers and administrators to organize strong and sustainable partnership programs
- Efforts to scale up effective interventions to improve family and community engagement
- Connections with the community

Send the cover page, short ABSTRACT, and ONE PAGE SUMMARY as a Microsoft Word or pdf attachment in your e-mail.

- You will be notified in early February via e-mail about the acceptance of your presentation and the location of INET 2020 in San Francisco at an AERA location.
- You must confirm that you will attend INET 2020 if your proposal is accepted for presentation.
- A registration fee of \$50 (US \$ cash, check payable to Johns Hopkins University-INET, or credit card will be paid by all attendees at the conference to help defray A-V and other costs.
- Continental Breakfast, Program, and Abstracts are included in the registration fee.
- An evening reception will be organized by co-sponsor Family, School, Community Partnership SIG (day, time, and location TBA).
- A laptop and projector will be provided in each paper presentation room. Other A-V must be ordered and paid for by the presenter.
